Weekly Letter

"Confirmation"

This coming Saturday 17 young people from the Sherborne schools will be confirmed in the school chapel at Leweston; this is a really important moment in their lives as Catholics, because, in one sense, they now take on ownership of their catholic faith. They will still have parents and family and others to support them, and at Confirmation, they chose a sponsor to be alongside them in the celebration, but they come to confirmation by choice – they "confirm" their Catholic faith. For me it is a great privilege to be the one who administers the sacrament that leads them into that new phase of their life with Christ.

Over the last several months they have been attending sessions led by catechists and others exploring what it means to be person of faith called to follow Christ. One of the key people who has been supporting and helping these candidates and their predecessors over many years, has been Sr Carmel. I think we all appreciate how grateful we have all been for her example, wisdom and guidance, may she rest in peace.

It has always been an important part of my ministry to work with others exploring and developing their faith – because I always have my own faith deepened and developed in the process. So, I'd like to share one thought with you that I have come across working with these young people. Appropriately it comes from Pope Francis, who has just gone to the Lord. I think it an important truth for our confirmation candidates – but also for me and you at whatever stage of faith we find ourselves:

"In the Mass we do not read the Gospel in order to know how things happened, but rather, we listen to the Gospel in order to realize what Jesus once did and said; and that Word is living, the Word of Jesus that is in the Gospel is alive and touches my heart. Therefore, listening to the Gospel with an open heart, is very important, because it is the living Word. . . If it is true that in the liturgy "Christ is still proclaiming His Gospel", it follows that, by participating in the Mass, we must give him a response. We listen to the Gospel and we must give a response in our life."

May this celebration of confirmation be a moment of grace for these young people, may we support them with our prayers and may this occasion cause us all to value and deepen our own faith.

Sunday Readings - a brief reflection

Sunday 4th May 3rd Sunday of Easter

Acts 5:27-32, 40-41; Ps 29; Rev 5:11-14; Jn 21:1-19

Today's gospel has a great many questions that might cause us to ponder. When Simon Peter says: "I'm going fishing" – is he giving up on ministry and going back to the old ways? It could seem like it – the lack of a catch has echoes of the time before they "left everything" to follow him. But at Jesus' words they have a mighty draft of fishes. It is worth noting that as at the finding of the empty tomb, it is the disciple "Jesus loved" who understands and recognises what is going on: "It is the Lord". The sharing of bread and fish also echoes the feeding of the multitude in the ministry – but here some of the fish and the bread are already provided by the Lord. John gives us clear indications of continuity with the time before the Passion, but also makes it clear that things have changed. These are the same people, it is the same Lord, but there is a new dynamism. And that dynamism is named as love, When Jesus asks Peter "Do you love me?" this is not just out of curiosity – this is to articulate what will drive the mission forward. It is only if Peter will recognise and acknowledge his love for the person of the Risen Lord that he can take on the role that Jesus has for him. The one quality essential for anyone who wants to respond to the call of the Lord is to love him – that is why the "beloved disciple" in the gospel is so important – that disciple can be all and any of us who can answer with Peter: "Yes Lord, you know I love you."

For reflection:

Do you find the ideal picture which Luke paints in Acts of the early Church encouraging, or is it "impossible"?

Do you give any time to reading the Book of Revelation? Why is that?

Please pray for Santiago – to be baptised this Sunday and for his parents, godparents and family. It is always a joy to welcome new members into the community, but Easter is, above all, the time of new life and the time of the gift of the Spirit of the Risen Lord, and so the time for Baptism.
