Weekly Letter

"Grandparents"

Last week we all received great encouragement and hope from our second celebration of First Communion this year — the young people in the Church can be such an inspiration. However, this weekend is the Feast of St Joachim and Anna, traditionally the names given to the parents of Our Lady. This feast which, is now designated for grandparents and the elderly, reminds us that the elderly too can be a source of inspiration. Pope Leo has offered a reflection on this — here are some of his thoughts:

"The life of the Church and the world can only be understood in light of the passage of generations. Embracing the elderly helps us to understand that life is more than just the present moment and should not be wasted in superficial encounters and fleeting relationships. Instead, life is constantly pointing us toward the future. In the book of Genesis, we find the moving episode of the blessing given by the aged Jacob to his grandchildren, the sons of Joseph; his words are an appeal to look to the future with hope, as the time when God's promises will be fulfilled. If it is true that the weakness of the elderly needs the strength of the young, it is equally true that the inexperience of the young needs the witness of the elderly in order to build the future with wisdom. How often our grandparents have been for us examples of faith and devotion, civic virtue and social commitment, memory and perseverance amid trials! The precious legacy that they have handed down to us with hope and love will always be a source of gratitude and a summons to perseverance."

"Especially as we grow older, let us press forward with confidence in the Lord. May we be renewed each day by our encounter with him in prayer and in Holy Mass. Let us lovingly pass on the faith we have lived for so many years, in our families and in our daily encounter with others. May we always praise God for his goodness, cultivate unity with our loved ones, open our hearts to those who are far away and, in particular, to all those in need. In this way, we will be signs of hope, whatever our age."

God bless us all - the children making their First Holy Communion, and the elderly who so often can help us to appreciate the gift of himself who nourishes us whatever age we may be!

Sunday Readings - a brief reflection

Sunday 27th July – 17th Sunday C.

Gen 18:20-32 Ps 137 Col 2:12-14 Lk 11:1-13

The readings offered this Sunday can be the occasion for a reflection on prayer – something that is always worthwhile, though seldom easy! In the book of Genesis there is clearly a very easy relationship between Abraham and God, expressed both implicitly and explicitly. This is quite clear again in today's passage. It is a wonderful picture, as if the author has deliberately portrayed Abraham as some seller in the marketplace haggling with a prospective buyer – constantly trying to adjust the price in his favour – and what a knock-down price he achieves! As we discover later in Genesis, Abraham's haggling is in vain for the city cannot be saved so great is its sin: there are not even ten just men there. Nonetheless we should note that Abraham's concern and his earnest pleas for God's mercy are for those who are undeserving - a lesson in prayer that all might take to heart when it is so easy to condemn others from a position of self-righteousness. The gospel too is about persevering in prayer – even though we need to make sure we don't portray God as one who has gone to bed and is loath to get up for a friend. The really important religious truth behind the parable is clearly laid out in Jesus' explanation: "If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" As all the great spiritual writers have emphasised, prayer is an essential part of discipleship; it is about living in trust with God, which is why perseverance is the key to these readings.

For reflection:

In what ways do you think that your faith makes you a person of prayer able to persevere even when you see no results? What helps you to trust God when you turn to Him in prayer time and again?
